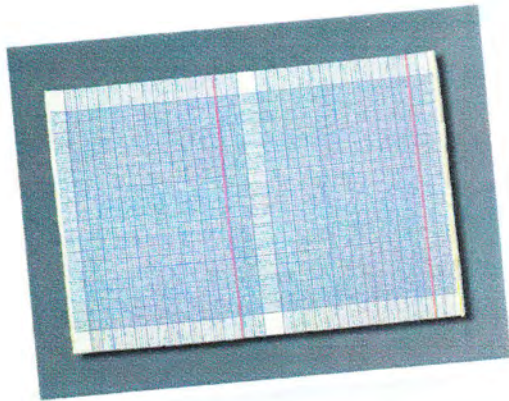

Playing with Geometry

HAY unveiled a host of exciting new accessories at this year's Maison et Object in January. We like Clara von Zweigbergk's *Kaleido*, a set of steel organising trays in striking colours. They come in different geometric shapes and sizes but all have 120-degree angles. This clever design allows interesting compositions when the trays are nestled one into the other. Meeting of Parts

Jens + Laut has given boring and mechanical office chairs a makeover in the form of the new *Graph* conference chair for Wilhelm. Its clear, deconstructed structure, sleeker shape and polished die-cast aluminium components give it a lightweight and elegant appearance. A specially developed concealed force- and form-fit connector also ensures no screws are visible, even on closer inspection.



Mixing Hues

Slicing the two translucent acrylate doors of Pastoe's *Shift* cabinets creates an intriguing colour play. It is designed by Dutch design studio Schotten & Baijings, who also created six special shades with their own colour pigments. Alternatively, one can choose from Pastoe's main colour range. Sartorial Reading

Local designer Janod Lim's *Rack* was inspired by the shirt collar, which can be upturned or worn down in traditional fashion. The upper portion of the magazine rack holds your journals while the gap in the middle allows you to mark your pages. It is currently a prototype but talks are under way for production.
